**KEY VOCABULARY**

**Celebration-** A special time that is important for families or a group of people.

**Autumn** starts on September 1 every year and ends on November 30. And the rest of the seasons are defined as Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter

**Halloween** Halloween takes place on October 31. It is a time when people dress up in costumes, go **trick-or-treating** **Guy Fawkes night.**

On 5 November every year, people across the UK mark **Bonfire Night** with big fires and fireworks

**Remembrance Sunday (Poppy day)**

**9th November** When we remember and thank the soldiers to fought to keep us safe and free.


**Christmas-** The time when Christians believe God's son Jesus was born.


**Nativity-** The story of the birth of Jesus.
