### Settling in

In September we will be holding stay and play sessions. This allows families to see the Reception environment and provides time for families to meet and chat to their new teacher.

It is also a good opportunity for the children to explore and locate the areas in the classroom where the toilets are, where drink bottles and book bags go as this will ease the children's transition on the day they start.

You should have an email informing you about which class your child will be in and whether they will attend morning or afternoon sessions.

You have also been allocated a stay and play time slot. (Parent and child meet the teacher). Please see the timetable on an email.



### The Daily Routine



Doors open at 8.40am (when the children start full days)

Doors close for register at 8.55am

Please say goodbye at the door, we will help them with where their belongings go and help settle them.

Children put their book bags in book bag box, drinks on named coasters and packed lunches away then hang coats up in cloakroom.







- We will stop for a fruit snack during the morning session. Fruit is provided for the children in school.
- Milk is available but you need to sign up using the form online (Cool milk). It is free until your child is 5 years old. <u>https://www.coolmilk.com/</u>
- Please provide your child with a named water bottle everyday.

### Lunchtimes

- Reception children will eat in the school hall
- School dinners: Vegetarian, meat and pasta/jacket potato options are available.
- All children in Reception get a school dinner for free every day if they would like it.
- Alternatively, children may bring in a packed lunch.

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 receive a free school meal under the government's Universal Infant Free School Meal Scheme. If however you think you may have an underlying entitlement to Free School Meals because of your financial situation, then it is to you and the school's benefit for you to apply for this. You can check your entitlement here.



### Usual School Uniform

- · Boys:
- White or gold polo shirt
- Grey trousers or shorts
- Bottle green jumper (or school sweatshirt)
- Grey socks
- Girls:
- White or gold polo shirt
- Bottle green jumper or cardigan (or school sweatshirt)
- Green skirt or tunic (not grey)
- Grey school trousers
- Green and white striped or checked dress
- White socks or green tights
- All children: Sensible black footwear, including trainers (no boots or sandals)

#### PE kit (unisex)

White T-shirt and green shorts

Trainers for outdoor games

Sweat shirts, green tracksuit bottoms may be worn for outdoor games in the winter

#### Jewellery:

Wearing jewellery to school is not allowed - it sometimes gets lost or broken and can be dangerous.

If your child has pierced ears, then they may wear small gold or silver studs. Hoop earrings should not be worn as they can be dangerous.

Nail varnish should not be worn and any temporary tattoos should not be visible. <u>Hair</u>

Hair should not be too ostentatious in style. Long hair should be tied back while in school. Hair accessories should be modest in size and in school colours.

- Please can you label <u>all</u> clothes, coats and shoes as well as drin bottles and book bags.
- Please show the children where they can find the labels!

#### Wellies:

Children can bring in a named pair of wellies which they can put on when in the mud kitchen. These can stay at school.

You can also bring in a bag with a change of clothes that can stay on their pegs in case it is needed. We do have a small supply of spare clothes.

#### **Buddies**

Year 5 children are allocated a Reception child as a buddy. Your child's buddy will write them a letter which you will receive at the stay and play session. There will be times the children get to play with their buddies and is a familiar face in the playground.

#### Seesaw

We use an online learning journal to share pictures and notifications with you. You will be given login details for this in September.

### PE

- Each class will have PE. You will be told which day in September.
- Children can come to school on that day dressed in P.E. kit.
- Please can we ask that you get velcro trainers as they are so much easier to do up than laces.



#### **Before School Starts**

- Reading daily to or with your child
- Practise using a knife and fork
- Name writing (capital letter followed by lower case letters)
- Get your child to tidy up their own things
- Help them to learn how to put on and fasten up coats and shoes
- Share the welcome book with them so they become familiar with their new classroom
- It is helpful if your child can put on and fasten up their coat.
- It is a good idea to you practise doing up buttons and zips at home with your little one.
- Please could you get shoes with Velcro so they can do them up by themselves.


At St Peter's we follow Read Write Inc phonics/ reading scheme which is used from Reception to Year 2.
